2 - Arrival in Tenerife

North Airport

South Airport

Tenerife South Airport (TFS): Known as Reina Sofía, it is the main airport for the southern part of Tenerife. Located in Granadilla de Abona, it operates numerous international and national flights. It offers modern facilities, shops, restaurants, and car rental services, ensuring comfort for travelers.





Car Rental

Both airports in Tenerife host numerous car rental companies, allowing travelers to conveniently pick up a vehicle upon arrival. This is an ideal option for those who want to explore the island at their own pace.

Public Transport

Buses (guaguas) run regularly between the airports and the main tourist centers, offering an economical transport option. It's recommended to check the schedules, as some connections may be limited at night.

Tenerife North

Tenerife South


6.1 - Puerto de la Cruz

8.1 - Teide National Park

The Highest Peak in Spain (3,715 m above sea level), a Volcano, and Stunning Landscapes!



You have to see it, because if you don't... you'll miss one of the most surreal landscapes on Earth!






The Teide National Park is the largest natural attraction in Tenerife and one of the most extraordinary landscapes in Europe. Home to Mount Teide, the highest peak in Spain at 3,715 meters above sea level, it's also the third highest volcano in the world when measured from the ocean floor.

The park's landscape is surreal, almost lunar, filled with solidified lava, rock formations, and craters. The Teide and its surroundings are recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Notable rock formations like the Roques de García appear as natural sculptures carved by the wind and erosion.

To reach the summit of Teide, the best way is via the Teide Cable Car, which takes visitors up to 3,555 meters. The final stretch to the top can be done on foot, but it requires a special permit (which must be booked in advance). Alternatively, there is a demanding hiking route like the Montaña Blanca Trail, which traverses volcanic, barren terrain.

At night, Teide National Park is one of the best stargazing spots in the world. The sky is exceptionally clear, and the famous Teide Astronomical Observatory operates in the area, offering fantastic celestial views.



8.2 - Masca

A Picturesque Village Hidden in the Teno Mountains, Ideal for Hiking through the Ravine to the Ocean



If you miss this, you'll miss one of the most unforgettable treks through wild canyons to the ocean! An adventure awaits right around the corner.





One of the main attractions is the Masca Ravine, which descends from the village to the ocean. It's a very popular hiking route, allowing visitors to descend through the ravine to the Masca Beach, nestled between towering cliffs. The hike takes about 3-4 hours one way and offers an unforgettable experience.

If you don't see them, it's like missing out on a colossal masterpiece of nature! A view that takes your breath away, whether from land or sea!





The best way to admire Los Gigantes up close is through a boat or catamaran ride. Not only can you view the cliffs, but you might also spot dolphins and whales, which frequent these waters, making the experience even more magical.

For diving and snorkeling enthusiasts, the waters surrounding Los Gigantes provide excellent conditions for exploring the underwater world. The water is crystal clear, and the marine life is abundant, with various fish species and the chance to see sea turtles.

8.4 - Anaga Rural Park

If you don't visit it, you'll miss a journey back in time to the era of prehistoric forests. It's one of the few places in the world where nature still looks as it did millions of years ago!






The Anaga Mountains, located in northeastern Tenerife, are one of the island's wildest and most mysterious areas. This region has been declared a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve due to its unique ecosystems.

It is one of the few places in the world where you can still see laurisilva forests, a relic vegetation that has survived millions of years since prehistoric times. The misty atmosphere, humid air, and dense vegetation give it an almost magical quality.


Barranco del Infierno, meaning "Hell's Gorge," is one of the most beautiful and popular trekking routes in Tenerife. It is located in the town of Adeje, in the south of the island.

The route is about 6.5 km long (round trip) and passes through spectacular landscapes, including steep cliffs, lush vegetation, and rock formations. The trail ends at the highest natural waterfall in Tenerife, which is about 200 meters high.

The trail is well-prepared, but access is limited to a restricted number of tourists daily (a maximum of 300 people), so it is recommended to reserve your entry in advance.

Due to nature protection and safety, climbing outside the designated path is prohibited.

This is an ideal place for nature lovers, as you can encounter unique species of birds and exotic plants, including cacti and palms growing on the steep slopes of the gorge.



8.6 - Cueva del Viento

One of the largest volcanic caves in the world.



Discover the secrets of Cueva del Viento! It is one of the largest volcanic caves in the world, an incredible underground maze created by nature thousands of years ago.





Cueva del Viento, meaning "Wind Cave," is one of the longest lava tunnels in the world, measuring 18 km.

It is located near Icod de los Vinos in northern Tenerife and is a fascinating geological attraction of the island.

It was formed around 27,000 years ago as a result of the eruption of the Pico Viejo volcano. Inside, you can admire unique rock formations, such as lava stalactites, basalt columns, and an extensive system of underground corridors.

The cave is completely dark, and its intricate structure full of hidden passages means that visits are conducted exclusively with a guide.

This is an ideal place for geology and adventure enthusiasts. Rare invertebrate species adapted to life in the dark have been discovered in the cave.

For safety and environmental protection reasons, the number of visitors is limited, so it's recommended to book a visit in advance.



8.7 - Garachico

A charming town with natural lava pools.



Garachico – the town that survived a volcanic eruption and still retains spectacular views. Today, instead of lava, you'll find natural pools, picturesque streets, and an atmosphere that says: "Stay longer!"

Garachico is one of the most beautiful and charming towns in Tenerife, located on the northwest coast of the island. It is a place where history blends with natural beauty, creating a unique atmosphere.

The History of Garachico - From Prosperity to Disaster

Founded in the 15th century by Genoese merchants, Garachico was one of Tenerife's most important commercial ports. Goods from South America and Europe arrived here, and the town experienced a period of great development.

Everything changed in 1706, when the catastrophic eruption of the Montaña Negra volcano occurred. The lava advanced relentlessly, destroying the port, many houses, and agricultural fields, almost completely halting the growth of the town.

Today, Garachico is a tranquil and picturesque town where you can still see the remnants of that tragedy, now part of the landscape and history.



8.8 - Icod De Los Vinos

A picturesque village in Tenerife, famous for its majestic Millennium Drago Tree.



Candelaria is one of the most important religious sites in Tenerife, located on the south coast of the island.


It is famous for its Basilica of Candelaria, a sanctuary dedicated to the Virgin of Candelaria, the patron saint of Tenerife.

A beach with sand like in commercials! You don't need to travel to the Sahara to feel like you're in the desert.









10.1 - Papas Arrugadas with Mojo

What is it?

Small potatoes cooked in very salty water (traditionally in seawater) until the skin wrinkles. They are served with two sauces: red mojo (spicy, made from peppers and chili) and green mojo (milder, made from cilantro).

Where to try it?

You can try them at any local guachinche, a traditional Canarian restaurant that serves homemade food and local wines. You will especially find them in the north of Tenerife, where more authentic family-run establishments have been preserved.



10.2 - Gofio

What is it?

Toasted corn or wheat flour, which is the base of Canarian cuisine. It is added to soups, milk, and even desserts. Popular dishes with gofio include gofio escaldado (a thick soup) and mousse de gofio (a sweet mousse).

Where to try it?

You can try it in restaurants serving Canarian cuisine, especially in the north of Tenerife, where traditional dishes are most popular. It's worth visiting the local guachinches, where gofio frequently appears in homemade recipes.



10.3 - Ropa Vieja




11.1 - Siam Park

13.1 - El Caletón in Garachico

Tranquil atmosphere – This spot is less touristy than other natural pools in Tenerife, ensuring an intimate and relaxing experience.

Ideal for snorkeling – The clear water and abundant marine life make this an excellent place for observing fish and other sea creatures.

Proximity to the picturesque village of Los Abrigos – After swimming, you can visit this charming fishing village and try fresh seafood at local restaurants.



13.8 - Charco De Isla Cangrejo

Charco de Isla Cangrejo is a picturesque natural pool located in the tourist town of Los Gigantes, on Tenerife's west coast. Hidden among volcanic rocks, it offers a tranquil swimming environment and breathtaking views of the Atlantic Ocean and the towering Los Gigantes cliffs.

Why visit Charco de Isla Cangrejo?

View of the Los Gigantes cliffs – It is one of the best spots to admire these monumental rock formations that rise up to 600 meters above sea level.

Peaceful pool – Thanks to the natural barriers formed by volcanic rocks, the pool is protected from strong waves, offering safer swimming conditions.

Relaxation away from the crowds – Although Los Gigantes is a popular tourist destination, Charco de Isla Cangrejo remains relatively quiet and uncrowded.

Ideal place to watch the sunset – In the evening, you can enjoy spectacular views as the sun slowly sets on the horizon.



14 - PRACTICAL TIPS

14.1 - Currency and paymentsi

- The currency in Tenerife is the euro (EUR).
- Most places accept card payments, but it's good to have cash for small shops, markets, and some restaurants.
- ATMs are widely available, though they may charge withdrawal fees.
- Tipping is not mandatory but appreciated—5-10% is common in restaurants.

14.2 - Language and communication

- The official language is Spanish, but in tourist areas, many locals speak English and German.
- Useful phrases:
 - Hola! (Hello!)
 - Gracias (Thank you)
 - ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?)
 - La cuenta, por favor (The bill, please)
- Internet is widely available, and many cafes, hotels, and restaurants offer free Wi-Fi.
- You can buy a local SIM card or use EU roaming.

14.3 - Transport and getting around the island

- Renting a car is the most convenient option—prices start at €20-30 per day.
- Highways are toll-free, but mountain roads can be challenging for inexperienced drivers.
- Public transport (Titsa buses) is well-developed—consider getting a Ten+ card for cheaper fares.
- Taxis are easily available and relatively affordable; always ensure the driver uses the meter.

14.4 - Weather and clothing

- Tenerife has a mild climate year-round: 25-30°C in summer, 18-24°C in winter.
- In the mountains and Teide National Park, temperatures drop significantly bring warm clothing.
- Sunscreen (SPF 50) is essential, even in winter.
- Comfortable shoes are recommended, especially for hiking.

14.5 - Health and safety

- Tap water is safe for washing, but bottled water is recommended for drinking.
- Pharmacies are well-stocked, and many medications are available without a prescription.
- In case of emergency, dial 112.
- The EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) provides basic medical coverage, but additional travel insurance is recommended.
- Be cautious of strong ocean currents—swim only in designated safe areas.

14.6 - Local customs and culture

- Spaniards eat late: lunch around 2 PM, dinner from 8 PM onwards.
- Many small shops and restaurants close on Sundays.
- Bargaining is common in markets, especially for handmade products and souvenirs.
- Some beaches, like Playa de la Tejita, allow nudism.

14.7 - Shopping and souvenirs

- Tenerife has a lower VAT (IGIC 7%), making electronics, perfumes, and alcohol cheaper than on the mainland.
- Popular souvenirs:
 - Handmade ceramics and lace
 - Canarian wines and banana liqueurs
 - Mojo sauces and local spices
 - Goat cheese and local honey

14.8 - Shopping and souvenirs

- Tenerife is a year-round destination, but the best months are September-November and March-May.
- High season (December-February, July-August) means more crowds and higher prices.
- The Santa Cruz de Tenerife Carnival (February) is a major cultural highlight.

14.9 - What to know before your trip

- Tenerife follows UTC +0 in winter, UTC +1 in summer (same as London, one hour behind mainland Spain).
- Travel insurance is advisable, especially if planning water sports.
- To climb Mount Teide's peak, you must book a free permit online in advance.

14.10 - What to avoid in Tenerife?

- Overexposure to the sun Tenerife's sun is strong, increasing the risk of sunburn.
- Swimming in unmarked areas ocean currents can be deceptively strong.
- Feeding wild animals applies to both city pigeons and marine life like turtles and dolphins.
- Inappropriate clothing in sacred places cover shoulders and knees when visiting churches.
- Going to Teide without preparation sudden weather changes can be dangerous.
- Leaving valuables on the beach thefts can happen, especially in touristy areas.
- Leaving valuables in cars especially during excursions or shopping trips.
- Ignoring nature protection rules don't pick plants or walk on dunes.
- Disrespecting locals loud behavior at night and lack of courtesy are frowned upon.
- Littering keep beaches and trails clean.

With these tips, your trip to Tenerife will be even more enjoyable and hassle-free!
